

Alternatives to using Roundup are vinegar, salt and some other products listed below in ***BOLD italic***. All products including vinegar still need to be handled with care, they are unhealthy to inhale and can burn skin, use gloves and stand on wrong side of wind, or “away from the wind”.

**Best Used on Sunny Days.**

***White vinegar***: put it in a spray bottle to kill weeds.

**Mix the following: the combination will help go into the root.**

**1 gallon white vinegar**

**1 cup of salt**

**1 tablespoon of liquid dish soap**

**put mixture in plastic spray bottle spray directly on target leaves.**

**add ½ c of orange oil**: this will kill poison oak and ivy, again on leaves.

***Salt***: spreading salt directly on weeds and grasses, nothing will grow in that spot again!

***Ecosmart products*** not consider toxic by US EPA – products use plant base oils, phenethyl Proprionate and Eugenol, which is oil of cloves: Note is can still irritate eyes and cause skin irritations.

***Biosafe products*** their weed killer is certified to use in organic BUT toxic to fish. - Biodegrades into soil quickly and relies on ammonium nonanoate, a fatty acid or soap salt as its activate ingredient.

***Orange Oil***: beautifies furniture ALSO adding to spray bottle of vinegar, salt and dish soap to increase potency of your natural weed killing sauce.
