

IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT YOUR DRINKING WATER

MONITORING REQUIREMENTS NOT MET FOR Irish Beach Water District

Our water system failed to monitor as required for drinking water standards during the past year and, therefore, was in violation of the regulations. Even though this failure was not an emergency, as our customers, you have a right to know what you should do, what happened, and what we did to correct this situation. We are required to monitor your drinking water for specific contaminants on a regular basis. Results of regular monitoring are an indicator of whether or not our drinking water meets health standards.

During 2024, IBWD failed to test for nitrate and therefore, cannot be sure of the quality of our drinking water during that time.

What should I do?

- There is nothing you need to do at this time.
- The table below lists the contaminant(s) we did not properly test for during the last year, how many samples we are required to take and how often, how many samples we took, when samples should have been taken, and the date on which follow-up samples were (or will be) taken.

Contaminant	Required Sampling Frequency	Number of Samples Taken	When All Samples Should Have Been Taken	When Samples Were or Will Be Taken
Nitrate	Annual	4 (one sample for each source)	2024	April 2025

- If you have health issues concerning the consumption of this water, you may wish to consult your doctor.

What happened? What is being done?

The State Water Board has determined that the IBWD has failed to comply with primary drinking water standards pursuant to Health and Safety Code section 116555 and nitrate monitoring requirements pursuant to California Code of Regulations, title 22, section 64432.1, subdivision (a) during 2024.

IBWD must ensure that each active source is monitored for nitrate in accordance with California Code of Regulations, title 22, section 64432.1, subdivision (a) and that the laboratory that conducts the analysis submits the analytical results electronically by a State Water Board approved method no later than the 10th day of the month following completion of the analyses. If the sample result exceeds the MCL of 10 mg/L as N, additional sampling and notification requirements apply. (Cal. Code Regs., tit. 22, § 64432.1, subd. (a).)

Nitrate testing will be performed for all district source waters:

- Irish Gulch Combined (CA2310012_012_012)
- Unit 9 Well (CA2310012_004_004)
- Tank 5 Well (CA2310012_008_008)
- Tank 2 Well (CA2310012_010_010)

Secondary Notification Requirements

Upon receipt of notification from a person operating a public water system, the following notification must be given within 10 days [Health and Safety Code Section 116450(g)]:

- **SCHOOLS:** Must notify school employees, students, and parents (if the students are minors).
- **RESIDENTIAL RENTAL PROPERTY OWNERS OR MANAGERS** (including nursing homes and care facilities): Must notify tenants.
- **BUSINESS PROPERTY OWNERS, MANAGERS, OR OPERATORS:** Must notify employees of businesses located on the property.
